

JIMMY FUND WALK “WALKER OF THE YEAR”



Our very own Junior Committee Chairman and Home Office Employee received the Boston Marathon® Jimmy Fund Walk “Walker of the Year” Award. Donald Ferry Jr, was recognized as a champion fundraiser for the Boston Marathon® Jimmy Fund Walk, a one-day charity walk event in support of the Jimmy Fund for all cancers at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in

Boston. Donald walked the full 26.2 miles of the Boston Marathon route and raised over \$2,502. On March 23, 2014, he was recognized as the Walker of the Year at the Walk’s Extra Mile Brunch, an event that celebrates “Pacesetters”, participants who raised more than \$1,500 each. The Walker of the Year winner is nominated by fellow walkers and volunteers, and is given to a walker who stands out among participants as a dedicated fundraiser who inspires others and demonstrates an unwavering commitment to help Dana-Farber and the Jimmy Fund conquer cancer.

Donald will again be walking this year’s Boston Marathon Jimmy Fund Walk on September 21st. He is walking for his mother Sylvia, a two year cancer survivor, and also to

honor an aunt, two uncles and his grandmother who died from this devastating disease. Donald asks your help by donating to his walk this year.






REFLECTIONS ON THE “POSITIVE SPIRIT” OF AUNT MINI

One of the many assets brought to us by our LDS brothers and sisters when they united with the Royal Arcanum was the phenomenal example and inspiration of Minnie Tvaska. When reminded once again of her unusual and outstanding bowling history, I decided to digress from the usual routine and write a Reflections article about this determined and up-beat woman. In order not to be confused with the famous Disney mouse, our “Aunt Mini,” as she is affectionately called by so many, prefers her name to be known as “Mini.”



Aunt Mini, age 96, had to finally give up bowling, perhaps only temporarily, in April of this year because of an injury to her left arm (not her bowling arm though). She had been scheduled to bowl in the Women's Division of United States Bowling Congress National Tournament this past May in Reno, but had to cancel because of the injured arm. She has bowled in that tournament for 67 consecutive years!

Aunt Mini started her bowling with the Lithuanian League in Detroit in 1939, and enjoyed bowling so much that she continued the sport on a regular basis until this year. “I just love it,” she says, “but have never really been a good bowler.” She is being modest. The highest game she ever bowled was 232, and her average this past April was 109. She used to bowl with a 16-pound ball, but now uses an 8-pounder.



By the way, Aunt Mini has been practically blind from macular degeneration for several years. When she looks down the lane, instead of viewing the bowling pins, all she sees are blurry white spots where the bowling pins should be! She simply lays the ball where she has always laid it, and off it goes. Bowling friends graciously tell her what pins are still standing, and she sends the ball down the lane again. Aunt Mini did say that she gets very frustrated when she misses the head pin, but rarely ever throws a gutter ball.

Our featured bowler spent most of her life in Detroit/Dearborn, Michigan, with her husband, Charles, whom she married in 1940. They were married for 58 years, until he died in 1998. He bowled too, but she was the “real” bowler! Aunt Mini retired to St. Petersburg, Florida, in 2001, where she now lives in an assisted living residence. Upon arriving in Florida, one of the first things she did was to find a new “bowling home”, too.

It's certainly been a nice summer thus far in New England, with periods of warm weather that help you forget about the long winter we had. Our Insurance operation continued to see strong production results throughout the year and I look for this to continue going forward. We have made numerous changes to our sales operation over the past year and will continue this model, staying current with the industry which will benefit our Society.

The Insurance industry has seen many changes over the past few years, affecting the overall business models for many commercial insurance companies. This type of change has made an impact with consumers and their perception of products available. I've seen companies stop marketing

and/or selling financial products such as Annuities. The reason for this is the continued low interest rate environment, which hinders a company's ability to gain a positive return on the Annuity money received. When this happens, a company can

face large losses based on the product sold in their portfolio.

As I mentioned in my last column, I visited the Massachusetts State House to testify on behalf of Bill H3542, which will allow us to amend our Investment structure as a Society. I've been made aware by my Representative that our bill did not pass through the first go-around at the State House. This will not stop our efforts to amend this bill, allowing our Order to obtain a better return on our Investments. I will be requesting this amendment to be submitted again during the next Massachusetts Congressional session. I was advised that the main reason the bill did not pass initially was due to a lack of support received on behalf of the bill. I urge you to write a support letter to the Massachusetts State House the next time the bill is in session, which I expect

to announce within the next Bulletin.

Thanks to Supreme Regent Peter Ferrara for his service the last two years. Peter certainly provided dedicated program support as Supreme Regent, and truly made Royal Arcanum better.




GRAND COUNCIL OF PENNSYLVANIA 2014 SESSION

A WORD FROM THE SUPREME SECRETARY


In this issue, the Royal Arcanum again honors our new scholarship winners. We are proud of their achievements and wish success to all of this year's graduates in their future endeavors.
