#### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Officers and Members of the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum

#### Brothers and Sisters:

In accordance with Sections 99 and 100 of the Constitution and laws of the Order, the Committee on Finance met at the Home Office on four occasions during the past two years.

An examination and verification was made on a sample of receipts and disbursements of the Consolidated Account from January 1, 2010 to December 31, 2011.

All claims for Death Benefits, Disability Payments, Withdrawal Equities, Interest payments on money left on deposit by Members and Beneficiaries and Cash Loans to eligible Members were carefully reviewed to ascertain if files were completed and the proper disbursements made with the approval of the General Counsel as required.

Active educational loan files were reviewed and examined. For follow-up procedures in the monthly billing, late payments and loans in default referred to attorneys for collection.

The books, records and accounts of the Supreme Auditor were examined and all orders issued by him were compared with the Vouchers in the Supreme Treasurer's Office. The Contingent Funds were checked and the balances verified. The consolidated Accounts were checked with the statements of the depositories and the monthly balances verified. The Payroll Account was examined and found correct.

The examination included an audit of all transactions made by the Investment Committee for the Consolidated Account. All securities listed in the report for Morgan Stanley Smith Barney, RBC Trust Dexia, Citizens and the Insurance Department of North Carolina were checked with the Annual Statement as of December 31, 2011 and found to be correct.

Our younger members play a very important role in leading our fraternal society up that pathway leading into our future.

I am very pleased to report that our Juniors are not just the Royal Arcanum of the future, but the Royal Arcanum of today! The many Juniors attending the Supreme Session two years ago were filled with excitement as they took their rightful place in the fraternal aspects of our Order in the beautiful Don Cesar Resort in St. Pete Beach, Florida, and all representatives seemed to be united in their determination to keep our Juniors active and involved.

There have been all sorts of special Junior activities that have taken place in our various jurisdictions: visits to hospitals and assisted living residences, walks and marathons for charitable causes, pumpkin decorating parties at Halloween, boat rides, trips to museums, filling Health Care Kits, picnics, parties, a day at the zoo, serving food to the homeless, and children's theatre.

There were some very special activities for the Juniors at the mini-vacation in San Antonio last year such as the traditional scavenger hunt and all the fun at Six Flags amusement park.

This year's session at Resorts on the Atlantic City, New Jersey boardwalk promises to be a fun time for young people, with the games, amusements, beach, and water fun. Education is stressed in our Royal Arcanum in many ways. Every year I send a reminder letter with this offer to our sixteen year olds.

The sixteen scholarships and five educational grants, along with our low percentage loans to students, remain one of the outstanding features offered to our Juniors. This year the scholarships and grants have been increased by about thirty percent. The Supreme Council is committed to continuing our educational program and scholarship program. New scholarship amounts for 2013 are; two \$10,000, two \$8,000, two \$5,000 and ten \$1,500. Also new for 2013 – five \$600 Educational Grants

## ROYAL ARCANUM SCHOLARSHIP FUND, INC.

The Royal Arcanum Scholarship Fund, Inc. was incorporated as a charitable corporation under the Laws of Massachusetts on April 14, 2004. It was organized exclusively for charitable, literary, scientific, religious and educational purposes under Section 501[c][3] of the Internal Revenue Service Code as a not-for-profit tax exempt status.

Members and non-members are welcomed to make a tax deductable donation to our scholarship fund. Contributions should be made payable to: Royal Arcanum Scholarship Fund, Inc. and sent to the Home Office in Boston.

# GUARANTEED EDUCATIONAL LOANS FOR JUNIORS

The Educational Loan Program is one of the premier fraternal benefits offered by the Order. The Executive Committee monitors the program to insure its success.

As of December 31, 2003, loans have been granted to 78 members for a total amount of \$578,659.40, of which \$380,130.70 has been advanced. Repayments totaled \$88,880.68, leaving a balance outstanding of \$291,250.02.

**GUARANTEED EDUCATIONAL LOANS FOR JUNIORS:** Newly enrolled Junior members with a \$50,000 - 20 Pay Life Plan, Single Premium Life Plan or \*Life Paid-Up at 65 Plan are eligible for an educational loan at 4% interest at amounts listed below:

Age 0-4 years	\$10,000 loan
Age 5-9 years	\$ 6,000 loan
Age 10 -14 years	\$ 4,000 loan

**GRADUATE COLLEGE EDUCATIONAL LOANS:** These are available for up to \$4,000 at 4% interest. Requirements: \$50,000 permanent insurance and in force for 6 years.

All Fraternal Benefits are administered by the Executive Committee, which reserves the right to amend, alter or discontinue any program.

# PARENT EDUCATIONAL LOAN PROGRAM

Effective September 1, 2004, the Parent Educational Loan Program was introduced, allowing a parent to purchase a permanent life insurance policy and secure an educational loan for a designated child or children. The parent's policy requires a minimum premium of \$40 per month. Two children may qualify for the educational loan for a \$70 per month parent premium; three children for a \$100 per month premium.

The parent designates the children eligible for the loan by including the names on the application. The children must also

have Royal Arcanum protection of at least \$25,000 Term to 25 or \$5,000 permanent insurance coverage. The loan amount is based on the child's age at the time of the parent's application. It may be as much as \$10,000.

Note: The maximum amount one child can receive from the Royal Arcanum loan programs is \$20,000.

## **BROCHURES**

Our brochures explain what benefits are available and the requirements for obtaining a Royal Arcanum Scholarship, Grant or Educational Loan. They are available from the Home Office.

## **HOME OFFICE BUILDING**

Our Home Office Building at 61 Batterymarch Street, Boston, Massachusetts is managed by CB Richard Ellis. In addition to the routine upkeep on the building, the following events have taken place in the past two years.

In October 2010 a Weil McClain boiler was installed. The unit is designed to fire No.2 fuel or natural gas. Steam traps were later replaced or repaired to ensure desired heat flow to all the rooms of the building.

Mercury Business Services, our tenant on the first and second floors, signed a new five year lease on April 22, 2011; taking effect on May 1, 2011.

In May 2011 the State inspected the passenger elevator. Following some required adjustments to meet regulations, the elevator license was renewed. In October 2011, Eagle Elevator made repairs to the elevator motor at a cost of \$7,500.

The building's front window was broken in May 2011. We had it replaced at a cost of \$425.00.

Old oil storage tanks were removed from the basement and replaced with new tanks in August 2011.

In November 2011 a new multi-function Konica Minolta (Bizhubb283) copy machine, costing \$5,280 was purchased to replace the old unit. In addition to copying and printing 22 pages per minute it has the capability of scanning (color or black and white) 70 pages per minute.

For security measures we installed a combination lock on the door to our computer room on the third floor.

In January 2012 an agreement was signed with CB Richard Ellis/New England/Asset Services to estimate the market value of the Home Office building, land value, market rent and insurance value/replacement costs. The appraisal fee for this work was \$4,200. The values were requested by the Massachusetts Insurance Department, our Auditor and our Property Insurer. The results of the Property Appraisal Report from CB Richard Ellis (included in a 150-page report) indicated the market value of the building and land was appraised at \$2,775,000. The land value was appraised at \$2,100,000.

# **HOME OFFICE OPERATIONS**

The Home Office Committee works closely with the Supreme Secretary, Supreme Treasurer, General Counsel and our Actuary on day-to-day operations and policies adopted by the Executive Committee.

The Proceedings of the One Hundredth Supreme Council Session were printed and sent to the Massachusetts Insurance Department, Supreme Council Officers, Supreme Council Representatives and to our Chief Agent in Canada. All quarterly and annual statements were filed in a timely manner in the states where required and with the NAIC and AM Best (electronically).

We annually file Form 990 (Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax) for the Royal Arcanum. The IRS allows for the parent fraternal to file a Group Form 990, which allows us to do one return for all our councils. All councils had been requested to submit their tax ID number to the Home Office for this purpose.

Our Canadian Actuary, Derek J. Hodge, completed our Dynamic Capital Adequacy Testing and reported that the financial condition of the Order is satisfactory.

Our Actuary, Allan Ferrone, completed the Management's Discussion and Analysis Report. The results indicate that the Royal Arcanum's operational results were good.

The auditors from Vision Financial Group reviewed the financial records of the Order and reported that our financial statements were prepared in conformity with accounting practices and they present an accurate statement of the society's financial position.

Our Canadian Auditor, John Milnes audited the statements of assets and liabilities and head office account of the Royal Arcanum Canadian operations for 2010 and reported that they were in accordance with accepted accounting principles. The audit for 2011, in accordance with new regulations, requires an Appointed Actuary Report (AAR) to certify the accuracy of the report from the Canadian Actuary. Additionally, there must be a certification of the reserves, preferably using the CALM method (projections with sophisticated software to calculate reserves). Louis Mercier, a consulting actuary in Toronto will do this work. He has previously worked with John Milnes. Allan Ferrone of CPS will assist.

#### **DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN**

The Disaster Recovery Policy established by the Executive Committee is routinely reviewed with members of the disaster relief committees, represented by members of the Home Office staff, CPS Actuaries, Executive Committee and General Counsel.

To improve upon the disaster recovery plan, the Executive Committee approved the use of a Barracuda backup server. This consists of two hardware devices, one at each site syncing data across the internet. A barracuda backup server has been installed in Royal Arcanum's office and one at CPS's Monroe, Connecticut data center. On a nightly basis, any data that has been added or changed on the Royal Arcanum's servers following the prior day's backup will be saved on the Barracuda device at the Royal Arcanum. This Barracuda device will then send that data immediately cross the internet to the Barracuda Device at CPS. It insures that all data at the Home Office is automatically stored and synchronized off site at CPS's facility. In an event of a disaster the offsite data would be used for recovery.

The hardware and software amounted to \$9,201 and initial setup costs were \$4,250. Monthly monitoring and maintenance costs are \$750 per month. An annual subscription cost for the Barracuda devices after the first year is \$1,430 (to insure that we receive any critical updates immediately). A fee of \$1,800 per year covers the replacement of any defective or failed part within one day and that we will receive new backup devices every four years.

The Executive Committee took this approach in an effort of preparedness so that the Royal Arcanum would be capable of regaining operations in a prompt manner following an unforeseen disaster.

## ROYAL ARCANUM INSURANCE AGENCY

Royal Arcanum's Insurance Agency, a separate entity from the Royal Arcanum Fraternal Benefit Society, filed its Corporate Annual report with the Massachusetts Secretary of State for 2011 and 2012. This agency is licensed as an insurance broker. Its purpose is to permit the Order to receive commissions on insurance products when we have alliances with other insurance companies. It has been established as a "for profit" organization.

# **ROYAL ARCANUM BULLETIN**

The Royal Arcanum's quarterly magazine, the BULLETIN, is printed in color and mailed directly from, RR Donnelley Publishers to our members.

Each issue features the Supreme Regent's message, product information, Junior and Fraternal Department updates, Supreme Secretary's column, Reflections column, council activities, special events, news from the grand and subordinate councils, junior contests and topics of general interest for our readers.

The BULLETIN is an excellent informational tool which highlights our members as fraternalists in action throughout the United States and Canada. The spring and summer editions recognize our distinguished service award members and scholarship/grant recipients, respectively.

Councils are encouraged to share their "news" of council functions, community projects, member service and junior programs by submitting articles and photos to the Bulletin. These provide the 'blueprints' for producing interesting and informative issues of our society's magazine.

E-Bulletins can also be viewed from the Royal Arcanum website. These feature additional junior puzzles and activities and highlights from various council events.

## INTERNATIONAL FRATERNAL SERVICE PROGRAM

Fraternal Service to our members and to the community, through charitable endeavors has always been an objective of the Royal Arcanum. "Charity" is the greatest founding principle of the Order.

The International Fraternal Service Program was established over 45 years ago and throughout those years subordinate and grand councils have actively taken part by donating to various charitable causes.

In 2010, 20 contributions were made through this program totaling over \$8,450, including matching funds from the Supreme Council. In 2011, 25 contributions were made through this program totaling over \$14,245, including matching funds from the Supreme Council.

We commend the councils for continuing to build upon the foundation of promoting the Royal Arcanum in their communities by sponsoring projects under the guidelines of this program.

# **FRATERNAL ACTIVITIES**

Our members throughout the Supreme Council jurisdiction continually demonstrate that fraternalism is the heart of their councils. Projects, programs and activities provide the opportunities for members and friends to volunteer together in a spirit of good will and fellowship. The mission of volunteer service in community outreach efforts and in support of charitable causes is evident on all council levels. Members are becoming more engaged to do good work as fraternal volunteers of the Royal Arcanum.

Reports, photographs, and acknowledgments of the Arcanians participating in fraternal and charitable activities

exemplify that our officers and members are dedicated to journeying on the "Pathway to the Future" of fraternal service, extending mercy and charity to help those in need.

In communicating recent "fraternal department" items of interest to the members, grand and subordinate councils received quarterly newsletters from the Fraternal Director. These provided the opportunity for members to report on their projects, exchange ideas and offer suggestions for future Supreme Council activities. Over the past few years, the "collecting corner" segment introduced readers to an opportunity to participate in ongoing projects for the benefit of several charitable foundations. These included assisting the sight-impaired, children's hospitals, hospices, pet therapy, the military and veterans.

In 2010 and 2011, the Supreme Council sponsored the Fraternalist of the Year Program. Based on scores given by a panel of judges who independently evaluated biographical sketches of the nominees, the winners were selected. Marsha Simpson of Republic Council #2197 in Ohio and Errica Conforto of Claremont Council #1655 in New York were conveyed the honors and presented with the Fraternalist of the year Award in 2010 and 2011, respectively.

In appreciation of their dedicated and untiring volunteer service, the Supreme Council recognized several members whose names were submitted by fellow council members, and presented them with "Certificates of Fraternal Excellence" at the 100<sup>th</sup> Supreme Council Session in St. Pete Beach, Florida and at the 2011 Mini Vacation in San Antonio, Texas.

Fraternal Director Cynthia Macon and the volunteer Fraternal Events Committee coordinated the Royal Arcanum Family Summer Gifting Project in August 2010 to benefit the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches at Safety Harbor. This charitable organization's staff and volunteers provide caring, loving homes and support programs for at-risk and needy children. We were delighted to welcome Scott Halbach, Director and four of the young students to our session banquet dinner. We were very impressed by the teens and the fine programs which provide growth and leadership opportunities for the young people in residence at the ranches.

In August 2011, the summer project was organized for Operation Comfort. Founded in 2003 the organization provides support, through a variety of programs, to wounded service men and women while they receive medical treatment and undergo rehabilitation at Brooke Army Medical Center, such as in the burn and orthopedic units. It was an honor to greet Founder and Executive President, Janis Roznowski and several service men and their families at our welcome dinner in San Antonio. Their acceptance of their life-changing injuries and positive outlook for the future were inspiring to everyone present at the gathering. It was a moving and memorable event.

This year at the 101st Supreme Council Session in Atlantic City, our summer project will be conducted for the Lorraine J. D'Emilio Foundation and its mission of service to help women afflicted with gynecologic cancers and their families.

The recipients of the 2010, 2011 and 2012 summer gifting projects were selected by a committee from suggestions made by our members. We appreciate everyone's support; their consideration and generosity extended made each one possible.

In January 2011 the "Lend a Hand-Lift a Heart" program was introduced to acknowledge the fraternal and charitable volunteer service and activities coordinated by the councils,

encourage publicity and to document the good work being done by members in the jurisdictions. All grand and subordinate councils are eligible and invited to participate in this incentive program for charitable activity. Councils in the jurisdictions of CA, FL, IL, NJ, NY, ON, PA and RI have been recognized with awards for their activity submissions.

In August 2011 the "Lorraine J. D'Emilio Legacy of Hope" Award to continue her legacy of volunteerism, was announced at the mini vacation. Councils must be the organizersponsor of the activity. The charity which was supported by the council activity will receive a \$1,000 donation from the Supreme Council and an appreciation check of \$300 will be awarded to the council for its use. The first Legacy of Hope Award will be presented at this 101st Supreme Council Session.

Council officers, community welfare and publicity committees are to be commended for their diligence in notifying the Supreme Regent and Fraternal and Junior Directors of their projects and activities, along with articles / photos which appear in the local press. Volunteer services provided by the Foundation help women affected by cancer enhance their health and well-being through participation in a professional program of support, education and hope. The Foundation sponsors a monthly support group, an annual workshop delivered by a GYN oncologist, free parking program for patients and their families while undergoing hospital treatments, "Feel Good Again" events and other programs of support for the patients battling cancer.

Sister D'Emilio, our Royal Arcanum "2007 Fraternalist of the Year" and First Runner-Up of the National Fraternal Congress of America, led a life of selfless volunteerism and she inspired our members to give of themselves willingly to help those in need.

A useful feature of the website is to offer assistance for our college bound members regarding admission requirements, tuition and other costs, programs offered, sports and other activities and campus life. The college and career planning sections are widely used. An "In Memoriam" section lists the deaths of our members and their councils on a monthly basis.

In the year ending December 31, 2010, the Benefits Department processed 532 death claims and maturity surrenders in the amount of \$7,070,972 and 412 surrenders in the amount of \$1,360.792.

In the year ending December 31, 2011, the Benefits Department processed 760 death claims and maturity endowments in the amount of \$3,204,539 and 698 surrenders in the amount of \$1,666,541.

## **DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS - DIVIDENDS**

During the years 2010 and 2011, the distribution of surplus totaled as follows:

# 135th ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL OFFER

To celebrate the 135th anniversary of the Royal Arcanum, eligible members have been given the opportunity to participate in a Guaranteed Issue Program whereby they can increase their life insurance coverage by \$3,000, \$5,000 or \$7,500 on either the Twenty-Payment Life or Single Premium Plan, with no medical questions asked and no medical examination required. The

program was made available only as of the anniversary date of the original certificate. The member is given 45 days to respond and submit the assessment to the Home Office.

The program began on September 1, 2011 and will conclude on August 31, 2012. This special offer has been successful for the Order and we are pleased that many members favorably responded to the program.

## **ACA PRE-NEED POLICIES**

The ACA transaction regarding pre-need policies was closed on July 27, 2011. Royal Arcanum acquired 5,658 policies with a total face amount of \$15,096,000. The Order received \$11,864,368 in cash, a \$50,000 mortgage on a house in New Hampshire and a \$5,000 CD held by South Carolina (This money is being held on deposit for our policies in this state).

## **ANNUITIES**

Effective January 1, 2012 the annuity rates are 3.5% the first year and 3% after. Annuities have been approved for Traditional and Roth IRAs. Members can purchase Traditional IRAs up to age 70-1/2 if they are working. Members can purchase Roth IRA's at any age as long as they are working and meet certain income eligibility requirements.

The Canadian Annuity interest rate is also 3.5% the first year and 3% after. The Canadian annuities can be used as a Registered Savings Plan (RRSP) for participants up to age 71.

# **INTEREST ON CASH ON DEPOSIT**

Effective January 1, 2012 the interest rate on cash left on deposit is 3%.

#### INTEREST ON ADVANCE PREMIUM DEPOSITS

Effective January 1st. 2012 the interest rate on advance premium deposits is 3%.

## MARKETING AND SALES

The Society's marketing and sales operations have improved with the agents of our sales force who are writing policies for the Royal Arcanum. Proficiency and persistency ratios are two areas closely monitored by our Coordinator of Agents, Donald G. Foley. In a competitive market it is a challenge to appoint and retain quality agents and have minimal policy lapses. However, proficiency in this area has greatly improved as a result of agent background checks, training programs and the expansion of our insurance portfolio, particularly the final expense and graded benefit plans.

We annually update Royal Arcanum's Illustration Software. Producers can go on line and down load the current version.

Royal Arcanum provides Pre-Need Insurance to Funeral Homes through our sales force. It is administered by CFL in Belleville, Illinois. In Massachusetts and Rhode Island we are equal partners with the Catholic Holy Family Society of Joliet, Illinois. In Connecticut, Royal Arcanum does not share with the Catholic Holy Family Society, but does have its pre-need plans administrated by CFL. The total amount collected in premiums by Royal Arcanum in 2011 was \$902,906.

In the near future the Royal Arcanum will do our own preneed sales in various states. The sales will be served by CFL but originated by Royal Arcanum.

## CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE ORDER

General Counsel has completed a complete revision in PDF format of the Constitution and Laws of the Order including an index. The document is on the web-site and available to everyone.

## APPLICATIONS AND FORMS

The MIB now requires all applications containing an authorization to forward the insured's medical information to the MIB. Therefore, all Royal Arcanum applications must be revised, approved and in use before January 1st, 2013.

## FORMS COMPLETED ON LINE

Frequently used forms, including "Application for Change in Name", "Direction to Change Beneficiary" and "Change of Sponsor" are now available on our website. The forms can be completed, signed and mailed to the Home Office.

The revised Subordinate and Grand Council Forms are also available on the website. They may be completed on line, printed, and mailed to the Home Office with required signatures.

# **UNCLAIMED PROPERTY**

The State of New York found that many insurance companies:

(1) would use the Social Security Death Index to determine if an individual was deceased and stop annuity payments, but they would not use the same Social Security Death Index to determine if a death payment was due, or

- (2) leave paid up policies dormant after death and there would be a delay in payment or payment not made at all, or
- (3) borrow from the cash value to pay the premium until the policy lapsed and avoid paying a death benefit.

The State of New York considered any of the above to be unfair claim practices as a result of which an unfair trade practice claim could be brought.

In accord with NY regulations, the Royal Arcanum is using an "official government list of deaths" to determine whether or not any payment is due. Additionally we are working with the Berwyn Group, a company which uses the social security administration file, records from state vital records agencies, federal agencies and their own proprietary death data, all of which are updated regularly. The Home Office is performing the search for all states in which we operate.

Bills are pending in the legislature of some states requiring that unclaimed property be reviewed and remitted to the state. We have a provision in our Constitution regarding unclaimed property. However, if these bills are passed, it is uncertain if the Constitution will hold up.

#### **EMPLOYEE PENSION PLAN**

The Royal Arcanum Defined Benefit Pension Plan was frozen, effective December 31st, 2010 and all employees were notified. Over the next seven years (estimated) the plan will continue to be funded until it is "fully funded", at which time the plan will terminate and be distributed to the participants who can then roll the funds over into their 401 (k) or IRA.

The Royal Arcanum 401(k) Retirement Plan was adopted and took effect on January 1st, 2011 and all employees were informed.

Some of the major provisions of the plan are:

- \*Employees are eligible after one year of vesting service.
- \*A 3% of compensation safe harbor contribution for all employees who complete 1000 hours of service in one year. Service prior to January 1st, 2011 is considered.
- \*A profit sharing plan with six year graded vesting. Contributions are discretionary with the Society.
- \*Employees can contribute to their individual plan.

  There are limits on contributions that vary from year to year.
- \*Roth contributions are permitted.

#### **COUNCIL MERGERS & CONSOLIDATIONS**

Treasure Coast Council # 2177 in Delray Beach, Florida welcomed the members from Florida Group #2001.

Due to a very limited and elderly membership, Baltimore City Council #357 requested to be dissolved.

Twin Peaks Council #2401 merged with San Jose Council #2384 in California.

Los Angeles Council #1489 was activated in California.

The members of Williamsbridge Council #1416 in the Bronx, New York were transferred to Claremont Council #1655, also in the Bronx, New York.

These actions were approved by the Supreme Regent during this term.

#### **RA/LDS SPORTING EVENTS**

Members and friends of the RA/LDS councils continue to actively sponsor family oriented activities, including the annual bowling tournaments and golf outings. In 2011 the 60th anniversary of the bowling tournaments was celebrated in Livonia, Michigan. Fraternalism is in abundance at these spirited events. Donations have recently been made to Ronald McDonald Charities of Chicago Land, Tuberous Sclerosis Alliance and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. These events are a testament to the dedication of the members to volunteer together to ensure that the traditions are carried on for future generations.

#### **NEW PROGRAMS**

Under the guidelines of the "Future is Now" program, the Executive Committee approved the distribution of funds to our grand councils for the purpose of sustaining and creating activities to promote the Royal Arcanum and its future growth. The program requires jurisdictions to maintain an active grand council and forward an annual report to the Home Office.

The "Reach Out" program provides jurisdictional representatives with current membership rosters to identify members and invite their participation in council business, fraternal and charitable events.

#### **CREDIT CARDS**

Members now have the option of paying their premiums and making loan payments by using their Visa or Master Card credit cards.

#### **CHECK-O-MATIC**

This web-based service allows members in the United States and Canada to have their premium payments made to Royal Arcanum directly from their checking or bank savings accounts.

#### STANDARD ANALYTICAL SERVICE

The Royal Arcanum utilizes the services of Standard Analytical Service, Inc., an independent organization that analyzes our financial stability. They base their report on statutory financial statements which are filed with state insurance departments. Their report indicates that the Order's solvency has a wide margin of Assets over Liabilities. This confirms financial soundness and a company's ability to meet all

obligations as they become due. The Royal Arcanum's solvency ratio is currently an outstanding 117.36%.

#### **MILEAGE ALLOWANCE**

Due to the increased cost of traveling to the Supreme Council Session, and in accordance with Section 139 of the Constitution and Laws, the Executive Committee prescribed an equitable method of travel allowance for members of the Supreme Council other than the seventeen (.17) cents per mile prescribed by the Constitution.

Officers and Representatives traveling by automobile to the 101st Supreme Council Session will be reimbursed at the rate of fifty five and a half (.555) cents per mile, for their actual mileage to the Session, up to a maximum of 500 miles and 500 maximum return miles. Miles will be developed by the Supreme Treasurer.

All Officers and Representatives traveling by air or other means of travel, will be reimbursed actual travel expenses for the most economical and reasonable method of transportation.

A meal allowance will be given to all officers and representatives.

The Committee on Assessments and Benefits and Benefit Certificates and Riders has read the Report of the Supreme Council Executive Committee and is pleased to report on the following:

#### ROYAL ARCANUM INSURANCE AGENCY

The Royal Arcanum's subsidiary corporation, licensed as an insurance broker filed its annual report for 2011 and 2012. The Society receives commissions on the sales of insurance products when the order has alliances with other insurance carriers.

## DEATH BENEFITS, MATURED ENDOWMENTS <u>AND SURRENDERS PAID</u>

We recognize the prompt attention given by the Benefits Department in processing all death benefits, maturity endowments and surrenders.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS - DIVIDENDS**

In 2010, \$138,155 and in 2011, \$168,913 was distributed to Royal Arcanum members in the form of dividends.

#### **TOTAL PROTECTION IN FORCE**

The Society charts our protection in force. The latest record (2011) is \$261,850,658.

#### **LIENS AND LOANS ON CERTIFICATES**

The total amount of Liens and Loans on Certificates was \$4,401.859 as of December 31, 2011.

#### **STATE LICENSES**

The Royal Arcanum is currently licensed in 28 states, the District of Columbia and three provinces in Canada.

#### 135<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL OFFER

We recognize the Supreme Council Executive Committee for promoting the Guaranteed Issue program during our Society's 135th anniversary year. Eligible members can increase their life coverage without a medical. This program is another indication that the Order values our members.

#### **ACA PRE-NEED POLICIES**

In July 2011 the Royal Arcanum –ACA transaction of preneed policies was finalized. The Order acquired 5,658 policies with a total face amount of \$15,096,000. The Order received \$11,864,368 in cash, a \$50,000 mortgage (NH) and a \$5,000 CD (held by South Carolina for our policies in that state).

#### **ANNUITIES**

The annuity rates effective January 1, 2012 are 3.5% the first year and 3% thereafter. Annuities have been approved for traditional and Roth IRAs.

#### INTEREST ON CASH ON DEPOSIT

Effective January 1, 2012 the interest rate on cash left on deposit is 3%.

#### INTEREST ON ADVANCE PREMIUM DEPOSITS

Effective January 1, 2012 the interest rate on advance premium deposits is 3%.

#### **CREDIT CARDS**

Members can pay their premiums and make loan payments with their VISA or Master Card credit cards.

#### **CHECK-O-MATIC**

Members may opt to use this web based service to make premium payments to the Royal Arcanum directly from their checking or bank savings accounts.

#### **INSURANCE PLANS**

The Royal Arcanum has a solid portfolio of permanent and term life insurance products to meet individual and family needs.

#### **DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN**

We commend the Executive Committee for their attention to the disaster recovery plan and procedures. Recent upgrades include a Barracuda backup server at Royal Arcanum and CPS data center. This mechanism provides the ability for our data to be automatically stored and synchronized off site at CPS and used for recovery in the event of emergency.

#### **INVESTMENTS**

Our investments are diligently managed. The investment income ratio on invested assets for the last five years is notable with the two values in this term as: 5.59% for 2010 and 5.59% for 2011.

#### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

TO: The Officers and Members of the Supreme Council of The Royal Arcanum

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In accordance with Sections 99 and 100 of the Constitution and Laws of the Order, a the Supreme Council committee on Finance met at the Home Office in Boston, Massachusetts on four occasions during the past two years.

An examination and verification was made on a sample of receipts and disbursements of the Consolidated Account from January 1, 2010 to December 31, 2011.

All claims for Death Benefits, Disability Payments, Withdrawal Equities, Interest Payments on money left on deposit by Members and Beneficiaries and Cash Loans to eligible members were carefully reviewed to ascertain if files were completed and the proper disbursements made with the approval of the General Counsel as required.

Active educational loan files were examined and reviewed, including follow-up procedures in the monthly billing, late payments and loans in default that are referred to attorneys for collection.

The books, records and accounts of the Supreme Auditor were examined and all orders issued by him were compared with the vouchers in the Supreme Treasurer's Office. The Contingent Funds were checked and the balances verified. The consolidated Accounts were checked with the statements of the depositories and the monthly balances verified. The payroll and Dividend Accounts were examined and found correct.

The examinations included an audit of all transactions made by the Investment Committee for the Consolidated Account. All securities listed in the Report for Morgan Stanley Smith Barney, RBC Trust Dexia, Citizens, and the Insurance Department of North Carolina were checked with the Annual Statement as of December 31, 2011 and found to be correct.

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EXECUTIVE ADMINISTRATION, HOME OFFICE ADMINISTRATION, JUNIOR ORGANIZATION AND NEW COUNCILS AND EXTENSION OF THE ORDER

The Committee on Executive Administration, Home Office Administration, Junior Organization and New Councils and Extension of the Order has received the Report of the Supreme Council Executive Committee and has reviewed the following sections:

#### **HOME OFFICE BUILDING**

The Home Office in Boston continues to be well maintained to insure a safe and healthy environment. A new boiler was installed, elevator issues were addressed and front window was replaced. The computer room is protected. Tenants have signed new leases. The building, land value, market rent and insurance value/replacement costs were appraised by CB Richard Ellis/New England/Asset Services. The market and land value was appraised at \$2,775,000 and land value approximately \$2,100,000.

#### **HOME OFFICE OPERATIONS**

The Proceedings of the 100<sup>th</sup> Supreme Council Sessions and all quarterly and annual statements were filed in a timely manner. The Home Office annually files the Form 990 (Return of Organization Income tax) which includes the filing for our grand and subordinate councils.

Our actuaries and auditors report that the financial condition, operational results and statements of assets and liabilities are all satisfactory and that our financial records are in accordance with accepted accounting principles.

#### **EMPLOYEE PENSION PLAN**

Effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 the Royal Arcanum 401(k) Retirement Plan went into effect. Provisions of the plan were thoroughly examined and our employees are eligible to contribute to their individual plan.

#### **CANDAIAN FRATERNAL ASSOCIATION**

On January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 the Canadian Fraternal Alliance (CFA) became the Canadian section of the American Fraternal

Alliance. This is a benefit for our society since we operate in both countries.

#### **JUNIOR DEPARTMENT**

The Junior Director has encouraged members to engage our juniors in the activities of the councils and in fraternal projects. The Sessions and Mini Vacations provide opportunities for our youth to take part in our family gatherings and in recent years the Junior Committee correlated activities with our summer charitable outreach programs. The educational scholarship, grant and loan programs of the Supreme Council continue to be well promoted and congratulations are extended to all the winners for their academic achievements. Contributions to the RA Scholarship Fund, Inc. (a charitable corporation) are welcomed. The presentation was made at the annual meeting in Denver, Colorado in September 2011. Our Supreme Regent, Fraternal Director and General Counsel took part in the ceremonies. We congratulate Errica and extend our gratitude for her commitment to our society and toward the continued growth of fraternalism.

#### LORRAINE J. D'EMILIO MEMORIAL PROGRAM

The Supreme Council recently instituted this program in which the Royal Arcanum will annually provide support to the Lorraine J. D'Emilio Foundation and its mission of service to women diagnosed with gynecologic cancers and their families. Additionally, councils have the opportunity to participate in the

"Legacy of Hope" service component of the program. In reflection of Lorraine's selfless example of volunteerism, a charitable cause that is supported by a grand or subordinate council's project will receive a \$1,000 donation and the council will earn \$300 for its future use. Program brochures are available from the Home Office. We encourage our officers and members to promote this program in the councils and sponsor a "hands on" activity in their community.

SUPREME REGENT welcomed the assemblage for the afternoon proceedings.

SUPREME SECRETARY called the roll.

SUPREME REGENT called for the presentation of Session Committee Reports.

Brother D'Emilio presented the following:

#### REPORT OF THE LAW COMMITTEE REGARDING RESOLUTIONS 100.1 THROUGH 100.6 PROPOSED AT THE 100th SESSION OF THE SUPREME COUNCIL

#### Resolution 100.1

To amend section 8 of the Constitution and Laws of the Order to provide "that no elective member of the Executive Committee of the Supreme Council shall hold no other position paid or unpaid other than being an elective member of the Executive Committee."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.1 be rejected for the following reasons:

The proposal contains a double negative ("no elective member" and "no other provision") which cancel each other out and the entire language becomes unintelligible.

Further, such a provision should not be in section 8 but should be in section 92 Duties and Powers of the Executive Committee.

The proposed resolution in its present form is unacceptable.

Resolution 100.1 was withdrawn by Bob Law.

#### Resolution 100.2

To amend section 16 of the Constitution and Laws of the Order "To add the position of Fraternal Director as a position to be elected by the members of the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.2 be rejected for the following reasons:

The position has, for good reason, usually been held by Past Supreme Regents. These individuals have "gone through the chairs" of the Supreme Council and have visited each jurisdiction in the Arcanum several times. The individuals have become familiar with each jurisdiction's strong and weak points. Past Supreme Regents are familiar with and knowledgeable about the people in each of the jurisdictions. They also know who to contact and how to contact them.

To have the position as elected every two years would mean a tremendous down time and expense to the Order. Each time a new person was elected that individual would have to become familiar with the fraternal aspects of the Royal Arcanum, the operation of each jurisdiction, and the people who are active in each Jurisdiction. This process takes time and money and duplicates what each Supreme Regent already knows.

The Supreme Regent appointed Jackie Wudkiewicz, Judge, Don Ferry Jr and Carmen Rodia, Tellers.

Vote yes for Law Committee position to reject Resolution 100.2. Vote – Yes 39.91 and NO -12.59.

Resolution 100.2 was rejected.

#### Resolution 100.3

To amend the Constitution and Laws of the Order "To add the Supreme Treasurer as a member of the Executive Committee."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.3 be rejected for the following reasons:

The Treasurer is assigned certain duties and responsibilities under the Constitution and as such he or she has the responsibility to report to the Supreme Council and to the Executive Committee. The Treasurer cannot report to himself or herself and cannot wear two hats in the transaction. Accountability is important and if the Treasurer is made a member of the Executive Committee that accountability will be lost. This is a clear deviation from good corporate governance standards. We all recall Enron and Worldcom disasters where corporate officers lacked accountability and were reporting to themselves. The Executive Committee should have the ability to discuss the actions by corporate officers and Senior management in private and with the freedom to speak freely. To make the Treasurer a member of the Executive Committee is a clear deviation from good corporate governance standards.

Vote yes for Law Committee position to reject Resolution 100.2. Vote - YES- 45.56 and NO- 5.94.

Resolution 100.3 was rejected.

#### Resolution 100.4

To amend section 91(a) of the Constitution and Laws of the Order "To provide that no elective member of the Executive Committee who has served three consecutive terms as an elective member of the Executive Committee be eligible for election to the Executive Committee."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.4 be rejected for the following reasons:

This would be an impossibility. For example, an individual serves a two year term as Orator, a two year term as Supreme Vice Regent and a two year term as Supreme Regent. This bylaw would prevent that individual from sitting as an immediate Past Supreme Regent.

Further, this proposal would prevent the Executive Committee from receiving the wisdom and sage advice of individuals who have been out to the various jurisdictions and have met, talked with and been with the people and learned their fraternal needs. It would be a waste of time and money.

Vote yes for Law Committee position to reject Resolution 100.2. Vote - YES- 44.26 and NO- 8.24.

Resolution 100.4 was rejected.

#### Resolution 100.5

To amend the Constitution and Laws of the Order to provide "the Executive Committee lacks the power to approve the purchase or acquisition of another fraternal society or its members without the full approval by a majority vote of the members of the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.5 be rejected for the following reasons:

This subject is already covered in The Constitution and Laws of the Order and the Statutes of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Such laws provide that the Society cannot merge or acquire another fraternal society without the approval of the Supreme Council. Members may remember the merger we had with LDS in which all the members of the Supreme Council, except for one, voted in favor of the merger.

The purchasing and sale of assets of investments of the Society has always been in the province of the Executive committee. It appears that this proposal is directed at the acquisition and assumption of ACA certificates. The ACA transaction was proposed and explained to the Supreme Council members by General Counsel at the 98th, 99th and 100th Supreme

Council Sessions. Questions were answered and at no time did any member of the Supreme Council voice an objection.

The Royal Arcanum was losing members at a tremendous rate. Between deaths and surrenders, membership was waning, participation was low, premiums were down, voluntary production was at an all time low and agent production was not picking up the slack. Acquiring "books of business" from other societies was the only viable method to keep the Royal Arcanum vibrant and active. Contrary to the proposer's position, the Royal Arcanum is not responsible for any of the debts or liabilities of ACA. We are only responsible for the certificates that were acquired. Those members bring with them any active councils which breathe life and participation into our society.

The Societies financial results have been great and that allows us to continue to pay dividends to our members.

Vote yes for Law Committee position to reject Resolution 100.5. Vote - YES- 46.56 and NO- 3.94.

Resolution 100.5 was rejected.

#### Resolution 100.6

To amend the Constitution and Laws of the Order "To include the following qualifications that General Counsel or any member or employee of General Counsel's staff not hold any office or position in the Supreme Council and his or her input be limited to legal matters."

After review the Law Committee recommends that Resolution 100.6 be rejected for the following reasons:

It appears that the proponent of this proposal wants to put a muzzle on General Counsel. The authority and duties of the General Counsel are set forth in section 93 of the Constitution and Laws. General Counsel shall have general supervision and control over litigation, claims and **other matters entrusted to his care under the direction of the Executive Committee**. The provision has worked for over 135 years.

It has always been within the province of the Executive Committee to ask General Counsel's opinion on many subjects that arise as they would request opinions from any expert or person with experience in matters of law and business. That prerogative should not be taken away from the Executive Committee. In today's environment every Committee needs all the help, support and advice that they can get.

Vote yes for Law Committee position to reject Resolution 100.5. Vote - YES- 44.91 and NO- 2.94.

Resolution 100.6 was rejected.






