A Salute to Distinguished Service





HELPING UKRAINIAN CHILDREN

Councils and members continue supporting the Royal Arcanum's fraternal/ charitable program for Ukrainian children who have been displaced by war in their homeland. Two years have passed since the country of Ukraine was attacked by Russian forces. War continues and the hope for better tomorrows is growing dim as more people die and more families get separated (for service and/or safety).

Through the Fraternal

Department, the Royal Arcanum continues to send funds, shoes and clothing, everyday essentials, and small gifts and treats for the Ukrainian people. Children's items are sent to the Felician Sisters in Poland who are caring for the youngsters by providing school and a home for them. The sisters are also operating hospices for the infirm and elderly, so healthcare items and bedding that are contributed are greatly appreciated. When it is safe to do so, food, clothing, and other supplies are transported to the sisters who have remained in

Ukraine to aid families and the Ukrainian military as best as they are able.

Spring clothes, school supplies, and toys were packaged as "Easter Totes" for the Ukrainian children. The sisters who are stationed in the provinces of Warsaw, Przemysl, and Krakow have expressed their deep appreciation to the Royal Arcanum family and friends of the Society for the prayers, compassion, and support to their efforts of welcoming

Ukrainian "guests" and for helping them to directly aid those who stayed in their country during such a tumultuous time.

The founding principles of Virtue, Mercy, and Charity continue to guide the Royal Arcanum's fraternal mission, as evident in the program for Ukraine. A warm "thank you" is extended to everyone for their assistance. May international peace soon be a reality for all.





IN MEMORIAM: FRANCES MAGNOTTA



1936-2024

The Supreme Council is sad to report the passing of Sister Frances "Fran" Magnotta on February 22, 2024.

Born Frances Barbara Propato, Fran grew up in the Bronx, New York and it was at her "Sweet Sixteen" birthday party that she was introduced to a young man, "Augie", who would become her beloved partner for

life. Following the party, Agostino "Augie" Magnotta asked Fran on their first date – to a daytime movie. That date led to the start of a wonderful journey together. They were married in 1956 and later were blessed as the parents to two children, Laura and Michael.

Fran had a long and stellar career as an executive assistant and office manager for several attorneys at their law firms in Manhattan. With attention to detail, Fran was knowledgeable and dedicated to the profession. She and Augie were devout and active communicants of Our Lady of Assumption Church in the Bronx.

When Fran and Augie enrolled in 1980 into Claremont Council #1655 in the Bronx, they immediately became immersed in the fraternal and charitable endeavors of the Royal Arcanum. They worked side by side, hand in hand for the growth of the Society on all council levels.

Fran served in various offices of Claremont Council, including Regent, and then advanced in the Grand Council to be elected to the position of Grand Regent where she led a successful campaign for the jurisdiction. She served as an Elective Member of the Supreme Council Executive Committee from 1996 through 2000, and as a member of the Committee on Laws from 2000 through 2006. In 1994 and from 2010 through 2018 she was a Supreme Council Representative.

In addition to the many offices that she held in the Supreme, Grand, and Subordinate councils, Fran served

as Fraternal Field Director, and on the editing staff for the Royal Arcanum Bulletin. She represented the organization at the National Fraternal Congress of America and spearheaded various national charitable projects for the Royal Arcanum. A major effort was coordinated for the 9/11 Fund following the national tragedy in 2001. When the Supreme Council convened for Sessions and mini vacations, she introduced councils to regional charities that were being supported by projects conducted on behalf of the Fraternal Department at the events.

With a strong allegiance to the founding attributes of Virtue, Mercy, and Charity, and recognizing the spirit of fellowship that abounded throughout the organization, both Augie and Fran dedicated themselves to having the Royal Arcanum continue to succeed with council productivity and innovative programs. As volunteer recommenders, they enrolled a host of family and friends as new members. For her steadfast efforts, Fran attained the Distinguished Service Award, was invested as a Legion of Honor Award recipient, becoming its 70th member and also attained the 1105 Royal Purple Achievement Award as a Royal Arcanum trailblazer.

When Augie was elected Supreme Regent for the 2004-2006 term, Fran graciously served as the Royal Arcanum's "First Lady" and trekked across the United States and Canada with him to promote the Society and to encourage members to volunteer as fraternalists to "Achieve Our Goals." Many lasting friendships were formed during these ventures and the visits created bountiful memories for them as Royal Arcanians.

Left to cherish Fran's memory are her beloved husband, Augie, their children Laura (John) Flocco, Michael (Katie) Magnotta; six grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren, extended family members, and many, many friends in the Royal Arcanum.

Fran was a genuine "Pillar of Fraternalism." Her legacy will inspire Royal Arcanians to volunteer with selfless acts of kindness done with compassion and understanding to help make the world a better place.

May she rest in eternal peace.

the challenge is to raise funds for


cancer research and treatment at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in Boston.

AIR FRYING GOODNESS

Air frying is a cooking method that involves circulating hot air around food at high speed to create a crispy outer layer. It's often considered a healthier alternative to deep frying because it requires significantly less oil, or sometimes none at all, to

Twenty-two bags and boxes of items were contributed by the members. The council supported the project with additional cartons of pet food, collars, harnesses, leashes and other treats as donations to the Bergen County Animal Shelter and Adoption Center in Teterboro.

The fraternalists enjoyed volunteering together for the shelter pets and are hopeful that there will be many happy "tales" of the dogs and kitties being adopted soon and with more to follow **Into the Future**.

BAKER'S BOX: APPLE OR BLUEBERRY CAKE

Enjoy this recipe from Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto for a springtime brunch with family and friends. It may become a favorite of yours for year-round baking!

Ingredients:

2 eggs

I 1/2 cup sugar

I cup sour cream

1/2 cup light oil

I tsp. vanilla extract

I ½ cups peeled & diced apples (about 2) or blueberries

Flour Mixture - Mix together:

2 cups flour

I tsp. baking soda

I tsp. baking powder

Dash of salt

Topping - Mix together:

½ cup sugar

I tsp. cinnamon

1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.





In a large bowl with an electric hand mixer or Kitchen Aid, mix eggs and sugar to cream. Add oil and vanilla extract and continue to mix for 2-3 minutes. Add flour mixture alternating with sour cream.

When the ingredients are well incorporated, add the diced apples or blueberries and fold gently.

Transfer the dough to a 9x12" baking pan that has been greased with oil and dusted with flour. Add the topping and bake for 35 to 45 minutes. Remove from oven. Cool before serving.



NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS OF OFFICERS

Section 19(1), 20 and 21 of the Constitution

The offices, including the committees, shall remain the same.

Forty-five (45) days prior to the start of the Supreme Council Session, the Chairperson of the Supreme Council Executive Committee shall appoint a Committee on Nominations consisting of four Supreme Council Session members (current or past), representing the diversity of our Order, plus the Supreme Regent, who will serve as chairperson for the purpose of developing a slate of officers for the ensuing Supreme Council Session. It is suggested that an announcement of this appointed committee and the nominations procedure be included in the "CALL" to the Session and in the Spring Edition of the Bulletin.

The nomination committee report will be presented at the Executive Committee meeting prior to the Session. At the Registration Desk on Opening Day of the Supreme Council Session, a list of the Nominations will be distributed to the representatives. It is recommended that a brief bio for each nominee be included. For positions that will serve on the Executive Committee, it is recommended that the bio contain relevant information such as qualifications, aspirations for office, their Royal Arcanum history, etc.

At the Supreme Council Session, additional nominations may be made from the floor. All those being nominated shall have been contacted by the member making the nomination in order to insure that those being nominated are willing to have their names on the slate. A bio on each nominee would be helpful. (A resolution will be presented calling for nominations).

For the election of officers, printed ballots including the names of all nominees shall be distributed. In the case of Line Officers and the Executive Committee, there must be individual ballots (unless the Constitution is changed), but the other committees may be elected on one ballot. Additional nominations will not be entertained at this time. Delegates and Officers will cast their votes, which will be counted by the two appointed tellers and the Judge of Elections, who will count the votes. (A resolution will be presented at the beginning to nominate and elect all Committeepersons and Trustees, collectively, unless there is a contested election. In the case of the two Finance Committee Members, Supreme Trustees, Committee on Juniors and Committee on Appeals, if there are more than four nominees, the four receiving the highest vote will be declared winners).

The NOMINEE with the majority of votes based on the Order's established ratio between delegates and officers shall win the election to his or her respective office. In the case of the committees, the required members for each committee with the highest number of votes shall be elected (the four Trustees, the three members of the Committee on Laws, the two additional members of the Finance Committee, the four members of the Committee on Juniors, and the four members of the Committee on Appeals).




