

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR: A TRIP OF A LIFETIME

Recently, my family and I got to cross one item off of the bucket list - we went to Costa Rica. My dream has always been to photograph wildlife there and I am thrilled that it finally happened. Costa Rica is renowned for its incredible biodiversity, which is one of the richest in the world given its relatively small

size. Here are some highlights of the wildlife diversity you can find in Costa Rica:

Birds: Costa Rica is a birdwatcher's paradise, with over 900 bird species recorded, including toucans, scarlet macaws, quetzals, and hummingbirds.
Birdwatching can be

enjoyed in various habitats from cloud forests to coastal areas.

Mammals: The country is home to diverse mammalian species, ranging from the elusive jaguar and puma to sloths, monkeys (howler, spider, and capuchin), anteaters, tapirs, and several species of bats.

Reptiles and

Amphibians: Costa Rica boasts a rich herpetofauna, including iconic species like green iguanas, various species of frogs (such as the colorful poison dart frogs), caimans, crocodiles, and several species of sea turtles that nest on its beaches.

Insects and Arachnids: The country hosts a staggering number of insects and arachnids, many of which are incredibly diverse and colorful. This includes butterflies (Costa Rica is home to around 1,250 butterfly species), beetles, spiders, and more.

Marine Life: Costa Rica's Pacific and Caribbean coastlines offer opportunities to encounter diverse marine life, including whales, dolphins, sharks,

rays, and a variety of colorful fish and coral species for snorkelers and divers.



Unique Species: Costa

Rica is also known for its unique species that are endemic to the region, such as the golden toad

(though now believed to be extinct), the resplendent quetzal (found in cloud forests), and various species of frogs and insects found nowhere else.

Due to its commitment to conservation and protected areas,

Costa Rica provides ample opportunities for wildlife enthusiasts and nature lovers to experience this breathtaking diversity in a variety of habitats, from dense rainforests to coastal mangroves and

volcanic landscapes.

Whether or not your dream is to also shoot wildlife in a place like this, Costa Rica is amazing for many other reasons and it is a trip you and your family will never forget.



generous supply of diapers and wet wipes, all to be gifted to the sisters to assist in furthering their mission of service.

The Sisters of Life vow to protect and enhance the sacredness of human life. They are dedicated to helping the mothers of the unborn, the unborn, new moms and their infants, those who are frail, vulnerable or ill, and those in danger of being put to death. As part of their ministry of service, they offer hope and healing where there is a need. Currently, the sisters are also stationed Washington, D.C., Denver, Phoenix, and Toronto.

Our fraternal family continues to be a beacon of hope during a tumultuous time and has been especially concerned for the children; lives are being changed forever.

Royal Arcanum members are extending compassion and support, spiritually and financially to provide assistance for the children's wellbeing. Monetary donations and parcels filled with new items and other essentials are routinely sent to the Sisters in Poland who are selflessly working to care for youngsters and other family members. Many "Ukrainian guests" are residing in convents until they

can determine their next step *Into the Future*. Additional aid is delivered into remote areas of Ukraine where the Sisters help families, the elderly, the injured, and the military. All donations made to the Royal Arcanum projects are directly helping the Ukrainian people.

The Royal Arcanum efforts for Ukraine have been evident in communities across the Supreme Council. Diane Bajor, a member of Versatility Council #2501, New Jersey, is an art teacher in Thorne Middle School in Middletown. Diane's works have been featured in numerous shows and exhibits. Among the awe-inspiring pieces that she created is a magnificent painting of Our Lady of Czestochowa which she donated to O.L. of Mt. Carmel Church in Bayonne, and a stirring image of first responders in the aftermath of the 9/11 tragedy in NYC. A talented artist, Diane's humble spirit and generosity of heart are qualities of a genuine leader. Always willing to volunteer, she is a supportive member of the RA's charitable projects and service initiatives.

Diane was deeply moved after reading a poem written by one of her students, Christina Borsa; in it she shared a poignant reflection of Ukraine – her homeland. Diane then painted a beautiful image of sunflowers – the

national flower of Ukraine – to be presented with Christina's expressive poem. The painting depicts the resilience of the sunflowers and in essence, the unwavering strength of the Ukrainian people; it became a treasured gift, as have many of Diane's works.

The Royal Arcanum congratulates Diane Bajor for receiving the Superintendant's Staff Award for outstanding service to the Middletown Township Public School District in May of this year; a recognition that is a testament of her dedication to her profession and to her students.

TYLER KOLEK DRAFTED BY THE NEW YORK KNICKS

Tyler Kolek, a Royal Arcanum member of Pawtucket Council #537 since he was a one year old, was selected by the New York Knicks of the National Basketball Association in the recent NBA Annual Draft. The last time a player from Rhode Island was selected this high in the draft was in 1974.

Tyler has had an interesting basketball career. After receiving All State Honors at Cumberland High School in Rhode Island, he was enlisted to play basketball for the prestigious St. George's Prep School in Middletown, RI. While at St. George's he received league MVP honors and was awarded the Gatorade Player of the Year award as the best basketball player in RI.

Tyler was then given a scholarship to George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia. At George Mason he received the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year award. After his coach Dave Paulsen was replaced, Tyler put his name in the transfer portal where coach Shaka Smart recruited him

for Marquette University in Milwaukee. While Tyler was a junior at Marquette, his team won the Big East Championship and the Big East Tournament. He was selected as the Big East Player of the Year and

the Big East Tournament Player of the Year. He also earned All-American honors.

"The Knicks are getting a fierce competitor," Marquette coach Shaka Smart said. "They are getting a phenomenal passer, a great shooter, a great teammate. He's someone who I think will fit really well with coach (Tom) Thibodeau's emphasis on toughness."

Basketball has long been a family affair in the Kolek family. Kevin Kolek, Tyler's Dad, was an All State player in high school and played ball in college. Brandon, Tyler's older brother, excelled in high school basketball, and holds the all time scoring record at

Cumberland High School. Brandon received a basketball scholarship from Franklin Pierce University in New Hampshire, graduating in 2022.

Tyler's parents, Kevin and Lynn Kolek, and his grandparents Ken and Judy Kolek along with his

grandmother, Clarita LePine, are all Royal Arcanum members.



GRAND COUNCIL OF ILLINOIS AND MICHIGAN

The Grand Council of Illinois partnered with the Grand Council of Michigan for the Buddy Program. The goal was for each council to



select an organization that helped people with low vision or blindness. In June, eight members of the Grand Council of Illinois visited the Hadley School in Winnetka, Illinois to learn about their work and present a donation.

The Hadley School was founded in 1920 and was originally designed to provide academic support for adult learners. In 2020, during the height of the pandemic, they re-imagined their program after thoughtful and intentional outreach to their learners. They redesigned their program to empower adults with vision loss or blindness to thrive - at home, at work, and in their communities. To date, more than 100,000 people have joined the Hadley community and 98% have found their programming to be helpful.

During the tour, we learned about the many virtual programs that reach beyond the school, including workshops, podcasts, and a peer-to-

peer program. They work with adults virtually all over the world. They also work with medical students and licensed practitioners to educate them in their services with the goal that practitioners will provide patients with meaningful referrals.

Our Home Office associates have been keeping busy with continued increases in new business life insurance





BAKER'S BOX: APRICOT-FILLED PASTRY

Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto is happy to share this recipe for apricot-filled pastry or Hamantaschen.

INGREDIENTS FOR DOUGH:

3 eggs
I cup sugar
3/4 cup vegetable oil
I/2 cup orange juice
I orange zest
2 I/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
5-6 cups flour
I Tablespoon baking powder
pinch of salt





INGREDIENTS FOR APRICOT FILLING:

(Prepare the filling the day before) or use apricot preserves

2 cups dry apricots I/2 cup sugar

Filling:

Place apricots in a saucepan and cover with one inch of water. Bring to boil. Reduce & simmer until fork-tender (about 15-20 minutes). Drain well and puree fruit in a food processor. Then combine with sugar while still warm and heat in a small saucepan until sugar dissolves (5 minutes). Cool completely before using. (You can also add some apricot or peach preserves to the mixture for more flavor).

Dough:

Blend ingredients in order listed, using enough flour to make a soft dough that is not sticky. Using a rolling pin, roll dough out to 1/4 inch thick. Use a 3" cookie cutter or rim of a 3" glass to cut circles out of the dough, cutting as many as you can. Gather the remaining pieces and roll them out again. Cut more circles.

Combine & Bake:

Place one teaspoon of filling in the center of each circle. Fold the dough and pinch the side of the circle to create a triangle. Brush each filled triangle with egg wash and sprinkle the top with sugar.

Line the pastry pockets on a parchment-lined baking sheet.

Bake in a 375 degree oven for about 30 minutes or until top is light golden brown.







147 YEARS AND COUNTING!

When people immigrated to America over a century ago, they soon joined together to share friendship, common goals and support. As a result, fraternal societies were born with members helping fellow members, especially in times of need.

The Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum was organized by nine men as a fraternal benefit society on June 23, 1877 in Boston, Massachusetts. It was founded on the principles of fraternalism and sound business practices for offering affordable life insurance protection based on a scale of assessment.

Dr. Darius Wilson, a medical doctor by profession, and founder of the organization, became the first Supreme Regent. He chose to name the Society, "Royal Arcanum." The Society's incorporation charter was granted on November 5, 1877.

By the 1890s, councils were established along the east coast,

across the nation, and north into Canada. Subordinate Councils were established in local communities and Grand Councils were formed to represent statewide jurisdictions and provinces. In 1940 boys were admitted into membership, and in 1956 girls were invited to enroll. In so doing, the Junior Department was created. In 1958 women were accepted into membership and with this step, the Royal Arcanum became a family fraternal benefit society that spanned two great nations in North America. The Society is based on the founding principles of Virtue, Mercy and Charity. Members promote love of country, home and friends; faithfulness to family; honor in dealings with humankind, generosity with those in need, and compassion for the bereaved and distressed.

Since its founding, the Royal Arcanum has promoted quality products and opportunities for members as they prepare for their futures. A varied and impressive portfolio of life protection policies for newborns through seniors 85 years of age has been developed and remains

in force, with new products consistently being researched and marketed to address consumer needs.

The Society, being organized under the Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, is subject to triennial examinations of its operations by the Massachusetts Department of Insurance and periodically by the other 30 states and District of Columbia where it is licensed to conduct business.

Royal Arcanians are always welcome to participate in socials, family outings, recreational activities, and other councilsponsored events. As new members enroll, the Society

continues to grow and advance the mission of fraternal service to members and to communities while demonstrating allegiance to the Society's greatest founding attribute – "Charity." The Society's long and vibrant history is a testament of the dedicated service of fraternal volunteers and their commitment to seeing the Society succeed for future generations.

This year the Royal Arcanum celebrates its 147th anniversary and with much gratitude, we toast our members for their support of the Society and its continual growth and progress!

I wish all of you a safe and wonderful summer. Good luck to our young


